Introducing PIP Seminar Personal Independence Payment Thursday 16th October 2014 9.30am ~ I 2noon (+ Q & A)


PIP is replacing Disability Living Allowance for aged 16+.

Bexley Moorings ~ New Young Adult Carers Service

At Bexley Moorings Project we support young people who have a significant caring responsibility for someone affected by long term illness, disability, mental health problems, and alcohol or substance misuse.

Chloe Airey, age 19 is one young person who has experienced first-hand the work that Bexley Moorings Project does. Chloe has a sister who has cerebral palsy and additional needs. Chloe helps her parents in supporting her sister on a daily basis. Chloe said "My sister is unable to walk and I have always helped my parents with things like moving my sister using the hoist or helping sort out her gastronomy pump through which she is fed"

The Bexley Moorings Project provided an adult befriender to give Chloe someone to take her out, be a listening ear and help her do things in her spare time. She also attended the young carers group where she spent time with other young people in the same situation which helped remove some of her feelings she felt.

Christmas is coming!

During the spring, 12 Bexley Voice parent/carer members attended a free 6 week Person Centred Planning Course in Bexleyheath.

The course was designed to introduce parents to the new EHC (Education Health and Social Care) plans using a person centred approach. The course covered:

- The history, struggles, dreams and nightmares as parents.
- How to create a one page profile for our child or young person.
- Creating an action plan—what is working and what is not working.
- Discussing and listing what is 'important to' them and what is 'important for' them.

The information gathered was then used to apply it to converting our children/young persons Statements of Educational Needs into the new EHC plan templates.

Parent Feedback:

"The course was emotional, it made me look at the needs of my child. I also have a better understanding of what other parents are going through. It gave me the confidence and knowledge to put things into action in an organised way. I really don't know how I have survived without a one page profile before!"

"It really made me question things about how my child feels and what he wants, not just at school but also into his future. It was good to reflect and share stories with other parents and there was much use made of the box of tissues!"

"Yvonne's enthusiasm and knowledge were amazing, the course left me feeling empowered."
