SEN REFORM SEMINARS AND UPDATES

Bexley Voice recently hosted a free daytime and evening seminar for parents and carers in Bexley on 'Understanding the New Special Educational Needs Reforms'.

Our thanks go to Kay Moore from Bromley Parent Voice who was our speaker for both seminars. She received great feedback from our parents and her knowledge and understanding were invaluable.

Places were limited and both seminars were fully booked. The daytime seminar was well attended and parents enjoyed a light lunch and an opportunity to speak to other parents. However, Bexley Voice were very disappointed that 10 out of the 20 parents confirmed for the evening seminar did not attend, taking valuable places for those who were on our waiting list.

We provided information regarding the new changes, implementation timescales, EHC (Education, Health and Social Care) Plans and how the new Children and Families Act may affect you and your family. Such as:

- ♦ EHC Plans (previously statements)
- ♦ The Local Offer
- ♦ Individual Budgets


If you were unable to attend, all the information from the seminars has been added to our website.

The new SEND Code of Practice from the Department for Education and the Department of Health, was published on the 11th of June 2014.

This statutory code is for:

- ♦ SEN coordinators
- early education providers
- health and social services staff
- ♦ local authorities
- ♦ headteachers/school staff

Extra SEN support in mainstream schools

Most children and young people with special educational needs (SEN) or a disability will attend mainstream schools. Guidance to schools on their legal duties is contained in section 6 of the code of practice.

The Code says that schools must: Use their best endeavours to make sure that a child with SEN gets the support they need.

In mainstream schools, a single category called SEN support has now replaced School Action and School Action Plus. Schools must identify pupils who have SEN and need extra help through SEN support. They should record this in the school records and must inform parents if they are making special educational provision.

Schools should meet with you at least three times a year to review how your child is progressing and must provide a report at least once a year on your child's progress. If your child is not making the expected progress, you or the school can ask for an Education, Health and Care needs assessment.

BEXLEY'S 'LOCAL OFFER' HAS GONE LIVE!

Under the new Children and Families Act introduced in September 2014, every council is required to produce a 'Local Offer'. Bexley's Local Offer, as with most councils, is in the early stages and will continue to be developed.

What is the Local Offer?

To provide information for children and young people from birth to 25, with special/additional educational needs (SEND) and/or disabilities and their parents or carers in a single place.

What is its purpose?

To enable parents and young people to see more clearly what services are available in their area and how to access them. It is being developed in conjunction with children and young people, parents and carers, and local services, including schools, colleges, health and social care agencies.

What does it include?

Provision from across education, health and social care including training, support and preparing for adulthood, housing and employment. It will also include travel arrangements for children and young people to schools, colleges and early years education.

The vision for the Local Offer:

- It envisages a multi-agency approach with joint commissioning to meet the needs of children through the local offer and through individual Education, Health and Care Plans.
- It holds the potential for other services to enhance the local offer such as leisure and housing.
- Keeping the local offer under review will be important to its development, improvement and the engagement of all parties.

The Local Offer must also provide SEND educational provision information from every infant, primary and secondary school and all further education such as colleges etc. This will be a vital point of information for any parent or carer looking for a new nursery, school or college during the transition stages.


