PREPARING FOR ADULTHOOD ~ PART 2

Preparing For Adulthood means identifying the support a young person will need to live a full and active adult life as possible. The Children and Families Act Law and the SEN and disability code of practice: 0-25 years, states that preparing for adulthood means preparing for higher education, employment and independent living.

Bexley Twofold are a local employment project support service for those with a learning disability. They help their service users with the following pre-employment support:

- ◆ Travel training
- ◆ Identifying suitable work placements
- ◆ Identifying suitable training courses
- ◆ Carrying out job search Providing access to a job club
- ◆ Attending job interviews with them
- ◆ By working with benefits agencies on their behalf

THE LEARNING CENTRE IN BEXLEY

The College fully supports inclusive lifelong learning and welcomes young adults with learning difficulties or disabilities.

They offer a wide range of qualification classes that cover some of the skills that employers are looking for. They also work very closely with Bexley Twofold who inform them about local employment trends.

They are pleased to be a provider in the **Local College First** programme run by Bexley Council, for young people who have just left school and may otherwise have left the Borough to go to college. OXLEAS TRUST - LEARNING DISABILITY TEAM

Oxleas services are funded by the NHS to provide specialist support for people with a learning disability from the age of 18. However, it is important to begin the planning stages for transition much earlier than this. The Department of Health recommends that children's services work jointly with adult learning disability teams from the age of 14 (at the Year 9 review) onwards.

Psychologists, social workers, occupational, speech and language therapists are all part of the team. The Health Transition Team will be hosting regular coffee mornings of parents of youngsters moving from Child to Adult services - keep an eye on our website for dates and talk topics.

NAS TRANSITION SUPPORT SERVICE

The NAS TSS is a free and confidential service that provides a range of information and support for young people with autism (from age 14+) and their families during the transition process from;

- ◆ Secondary school to post 16/ further education.
- ◆ Post 16/further education to higher education or adult services.
- ◆ Higher education to adult services.

They aim to empower individuals and families with the correct information so that they are able to advocate effectively to professionals, have a good quality transition plan, that they receive the support they need in the future and that transitions are well managed and have a positive impact on people's lives.

Because the transition process can often be a long and at times difficult process, they strongly advise individuals/families to contact them from as early as possible (year 9) to ensure you are aware of the process, your rights and entitlements etc.

They offer support and information on a range of subjects including;

- ◆ Questions about preparing for leaving school.
- ◆ Planning for a big transition.
- ◆ Accessing further or higher education.
- ◆ What are adult services and what is available in my area?
- ◆ What am I and my family entitled to when I am 18?
- ◆ Support to understand and ensure the community care assessments.

Although the TSS is part of the National Autistic Society, they offer a range of information on a variety of providers and services that will best meet you and your child's needs.

You can contact the TSS on email at transitionsupport@nas.org.uk or leave a message on 0808 800 0027. Please be aware that during busier periods it can take several days to contact you but rest assured one of their VIPs will be in touch as soon as they can.

LITTLE STARS

Little Stars introduces the principles of conductive education to parents of pre-school children who have a physical impairment or delayed motor development. The team work towards helping children to meet the challenges they face independently with an emphasis on developing the child's abilities through active learning.

The program is run in a small group setting using games, songs and toys to motivate the children. They aim to encourage each child to achieve in everyday activities such as;

- ◆ General mobility
- ◆ Communication/attention skills
- ◆ Purposeful play and self esteem
- ◆ Eating, drinking and dressing

The **Bubbz** team has a high adult to child ratio, which works together with Fizz, All Stars (formally Buzz) and Free60. This venue is for children aged 5-14 years with a mild/moderate diagnosis of additional needs or for children who may find the large venues intimidating and may need a more tailored environment to suit their individual needs.

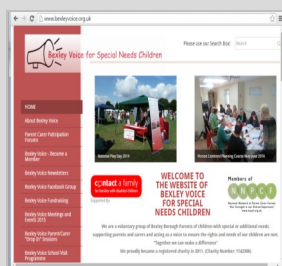

The team enjoyed the course so much that we are now meeting up every month to support each other and continue building our team 'confidence'.



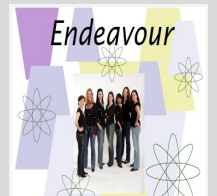
