PATHFINDER UPDATE ~ THE NEXT STAGES

On 28th June, Bexley Voice hosted a meeting of local parent forums involved with pathfinder projects for the SEN Green paper. Held at Danson Youth Centre. It was attended by parent/carers from Bexley Voice, Bromley Parent Voice, Greenwich and Lewisham forums. The day was led by Stuart Bromwich From Mott MacDonald – the consultants charged with supporting Local Authorities and parent forums involved in pathfinder work. This provided us with an update on pathfinder progress nationally along with an opportunity to discuss local progress and issues.

The BV committee have also met with an independent consultant, provided by Contact a Family, in order for us to ensure we are adequately prepared, as a group, to undertake the support and evaluation role we have been invited to provide for certain areas of the Bexley Pathfinder.

With the publication of the Governments 'Next Steps' document, outlining:

- * The replacement of SEN Statements with a single Education, Health and Care Plan from 2014 (including comparable statutory protections).
- * The requirement for Local Authorities to publish a 'Local Offer' showing the support available to disabled children and young people, those with SEN and their families.
- * The right to a personal budget for those with an Education, Health and Care Plan.
- * A mediation service to simplify/speed up the resolution of disputes and giving children the right to appeal if they are unhappy with their support.

It is important that all parent/carers are clear about the

impact of these changes on their child and family.

CONSULTATION We have been asked to consult with parents on a range of different local issues and are considering holding a 'Consultation Day' where parents would have the opportunity to have their say about a range of things. It will be in September – please keep an eye on the website for the date and location.



Review of Respite Services for People with Learning Disabilities

Following the consultation that took place earlier this year, Bexley Council is now part way through a 12 month review of the adult respite service. The Council have already carried out a number of focus groups with carers, and are now seeking service users feedback on the type, timing and location of activities they would like to access. The Council would also like to hear from parents and carers of children with learning disabilities who may access respite services in the future in order to fully understand people's requirements and to help shape the service going forward.

There will be a number of events after the summer, for people to participate in the development of the service requirements and we would like to hear from any parents and carers who would like to be involved. BEXLEY NAS NEWS The local branch of the National Autistic Society will be offering two Family Holiday Club sessions a week over August, as well as their usual calendar of activities. The Family Holiday Club sessions are for all the family and they aim to offer a range of activities for the children and young people as well as something for the parent/carers. You need to be a member to be able to access this programme – you just need to live in Bexley and have a child or children on the Autistic Spectrum - it's free. Bubblz is for 5-11yrs and is a venue with a high adult to child ratio which works with Fizz and Buzz, for children with a mild/moderate diagnosis or additional needs. Or for children who find the large venues too intimidating or need a more tailored environment. Children are supported to have fun, build self-esteem and where appropriate, enable them to integrate in Fizz or Buzz activities. You need to register for all clubs and you need to book in each day, registration opens at 12.15pm. Lark in the Park has something for everyone of all ages across the whole 16 days.
