SCHOOL VISIT PROGRAMME

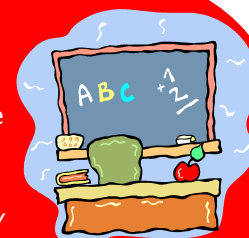
Our visits to schools within Bexley have really taken off. We have received some positive feedback from parents that we would like to share with you;

"The BV coffee morning was at my daughter's school in Sidcup. I had never heard of BV before, so it was a good way to find out more about you. It was also nice to get together with other parents, even though we had different issues. Since joining the group I have got some helpful advice. My daughter has a rare condition and we often feel like we are swimming against the tide so it is nice to feel that we are not completely alone. It would be nice if these could continue into secondary schools".

"My daughter is Dyslexic and struggling at school. I have some lovely friends who try to understand but unless you have gone through it, you can't. It can get you down and you feel alone at times. It is lovely to have the support from these wonderful people who are giving up their time so that we can all feel supported and get information".
